#### **Submission**

We invite you to submit an extended abstract of your work to be considered for presentation at WISE 2015. Submission can be done through the submission portal available on the WISE web site (<a href="https://www.wiseconf.org">www.wiseconf.org</a>), beginning on August 14<sup>th</sup>, 2015.

The extended abstract should be no more than 5 pages in length (double-spaced, 12 pt. font, 1 inch margins) including everything, except for references (references can be included in the  $6^{th}$  page). The only acceptable file format is PDF.

Coauthored works should be submitted under the name of the author that will be presenting, if accepted, and submissions are limited to one per person.

In order to minimize the repeated exposure of the same paper, we encourage authors to submit only papers which will not be presented at either ICIS 2015 or WITS 2015. We will remove any paper from the WISE 2015 program, if the paper is included for presentation at ICIS 2015 or WITS 2015.

WISE does not assume copyrights over the work accepted for presentation and does not publish formal proceedings. Accepted extended abstracts included in the program will be posted unless otherwise requested by the submitting author.
